Legislative Subcommittee Mark Alexander, Chair</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Mark Alexander reported Governor Greitens signed SB 503 which included 911 issues, medical directors expanded role, and special medical needs of patients at home.</li> <li>• All the departments have been asked to go through all the regulations to make sure still valid. Some open meetings may take place.</li> <li>• SB 50 (TCD) bill passed. It was sponsored by MHA and allows using a national designation instead of going thru state inspection to attain a level designation. However, DHSS has indicated they will continue inspections to designate TCD levels until the regulations for the SB are in place. Letters citing concerns regarding the designation of stroke and STEMI centers have been issued from MHA to DHSS and to Governor Greitens. Helen Sandkuhl said MHA as sent email to hospitals concerning this issue. Sarah Wilson is the contact at MHA for questions. SB50 also allows more empowerment to EMS regions and the regional plans. It provides an opportunity to improve the TCD system including data collection and peer review. Hospital participation remains voluntary while EMS participation is mandatory.,</li> </ul>		
<b>D. Education Subcommittee Chuck Doss, Chair</b>	<p>Chuck Doss was unable to attend SAC today. He sent a report to Ruby Mehrer to relay as follows:</p> <p>The educational subcommittee met on July 19 via conference call. The primary discussion centered around the federal financial aid issue. We are currently circulating among the educators some proposed language for feedback. The proposed language would update the current regulations to be more in line with current educational standards and best practices. Our next conference call is scheduled for August 16<sup>th</sup> at noon.</p>

<b>Center for Patient Safety Lee Varner</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Les Varner reported CPS held a boot camp today in conjunction with Mo EMS Conf &amp; Expo. It was well attended. Feedback was positive. Lee thanked all including Dr. Froelk, saying his presentation was very well prepared and well received.</li> <li>• Dr. Froelke is now the CPS medical advisor and will be working with the center on efforts for pt. safety in EMS.</li> <li>• Sept 19-21 Just Culture training to become a trainer will be held. <b>New Business and Announcements</b>			
<b>Old Business</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Chief John Romeo from SCCAD and Mark Flauter from Florissant Valley FPD spoke regarding state funding for NEMSIS 2. It is believed \$30,000 is needed. A small group of people approached the East Central Region to talk about grants. No response yet. It came to light today that there is work in progress to get the hardware in place to handle NEMSIS 3. Many EMS agencies have already transitioned to NEMSIS 3. DHSS cannot receive info from NEMSIS 3 so it makes it difficult to meet the requirement of sending reports to the state. There was</li> </ul>		

some discussion on whether the \$30,000 was a one-time fee or an annual fee. Jason White said if the state can't find \$30,000, then the industry needs to step up to pay it. Mark Alexander expressed concern to Dr. Williams, DHSS Director and he was surprised. Mark still sending his data to the state so he concluded someone must be paying for Image Trend. Shirley said it used to come out of out of EMSC. Data submission can make servers go down if not provided on staggered submission days. Mark Flauter said your Medicare payments could be affected if the reporting of data not completed. Could lose up to 55% of revenue. Joan Eberhardt asked if any request for grant money has gone to Missouri Foundation for Health. Mark Alexander said they tried that a year ago and MFH took it off their plate. It is a touchy situation because of the political implications. Jason White said it is just a phone call and we should make it.

- Dr Andrews asked two years ago about helping financially to get trauma regs going. The state indicated the money would have to go into the general fund which might result in it being used for other things. It was suggested donating the server if we couldn't be assured money goes to the right expense.
- Dr. Froelke said we need to know if we are keeping the lights on or if we are addressing a problem that needs a solution. He said we need to look at the bigger picture and revisit charging for licenses and fees. Must have revenue to make things work.
- Dr. Andrews wants to prepare bullet points for Governor Greitens to give him information. Dr. Chuck Sheppard said we need to create a top 3-4 issues. Dr. Andrews says she has stated a list. Data is one of her key issues. Dr. Andrews indicated we are off to a good start with the governor. SB 503 signed in fire station.
- Dr. Andrews would like to see more MO emergency doctors do more networking. Docs identified as ones who could ignite a movement are Dr. Scott Gilmore., Dr. Froelke, Dr. Gustafson, Dr. Sheppard, and Dr. Tan. Dr. Andrews would like to have more doctors and more EMS people active in discussions and networking. She said the

	regional medical directors need more opportunities to network as well.		
<b>New Business</b>	<p>Dr. Brian Froelke spoke about strategic planning needed since the Governor signed SB 503. Physicians area empowered but getting them together is hard. Dr. Froelke wants to use this group to assist with all the needed tasks in relationship to this issue. Local medical directors etc. may identify some goals that need to be achieved. The regional medical directors may be able to help. The regs and rules of SB503 need to be developed as a joint effort of all disciplines in order to get them right. Best practices need to be implemented from the beginning. We have law but no implementation yet. Some places are needing help as asap. A time table would be beneficial. We need to engage enough people to work on different tasks as parallel groups to expedite the process.</p> <p>Dr. Froelke met with EMS providers and said they express wanting more timely and more detailed information from hospitals so prehospital patient care can be evaluated.</p> <p>Dr. Andrews said her EMS providers are given opportunities to watch cath labs and stroke procedures. The experiences increase their awareness of need to save time. 60% of EMS is working perfectly fine per Dr. Froelke which he said used to be just the opposite.</p> <p>Dr. Andrews encouraged contacting Chuck Doss with thoughts about the education subcommittee and training issues.</p>
