## II. Trauma Statute Update and Regulations

Nicole Gamm said the proposed and emergency regulations were filed on November 21<sup>st</sup> and they went into effect on December 2<sup>nd</sup>. They are citing to those new regulations now. The formal comment period opened January 3<sup>rd</sup> and closes February 2<sup>nd</sup>. She did clarify that this comment period is only for those emergency rules that have been filed. She stated there has been some confusion related to what rules are in effect. She encouraged everyone to reach out to her with any questions. Licensure for personnel regulation has been reviewed.</p> <p>The legislative season is underway—Peer Review is one of the most important bills being filed. <p><b>Emergency Management</b> <b>Helen Sandkuhl, Chair</b></p>	<p>Helen Sandkuhl said the committee did not meet in January. At the last meeting the Ebola plan was reviewed. Six areas of concern needed answers. MHA and DHSS will be contacted to get updated information. The Amtrak train derailment presentation has been postponed until the February SAC meeting. RSV cases have been trending downward. Most Influenza cases reported by the week ending Jan 7<sup>th</sup> were Type A. The second week of January showed a big drop in cases. There have been 115 deaths reported this year in MO from influenza.</p> <p>Jason White asked about the Health Department communicating with the local ambulance agency about Ebola cases in their area. The Health Department does not give out addresses. Mark Alexander shared that PSAPS should know if there is a quarantine for 21 days. In the SW Region an exposed patient is monitored and will be treated if they become symptomatic. Meetings have been held with MU Emergency Medicine researchers as well as Steve Bollin and others at DHSS. Progress has been steady and wide spread support has been expressed. Kayla Riel spoke briefly referencing CARES data MU collects and analyzes.</p> <p>Jason White traced the ‘history’ of the project. The idea of getting meaningful data analyzed and reports generated was sparked at the CARES Gala in October of 2022. Multiple conversations with key people across the state has resulted in an agreement that engagement with the MU Emergency Medicine researchers should be pursued.</p> <p>Steve Bollin said he thought there is some promise with this project. He said he has background work to so but</p>

<p><b>Reg A</b> <b>Dr. David Gustafson, Chair</b></p>	<p>Dr. David Gustafson reporting: Region A met Jan 9. Jason White gave a legislative update. Kayla Riel gave Cares report. Dr. Gustafson said some of his EMS agencies have not been reporting CARES data. He is hoping to change that.</p> <p>Shane Lockard related that WPS has been considering geography only as the closest appropriate hospital (assuming the specialty needed was available). An example: a Warrensburg patient being transported for Urology problem would have mileage paid to Sedalia—the closest hospital with a Urologist on staff. Patient choice was not an adequate reason to be transported to a KC hospital etc. Documentation has to be clear on why the patient went to a different destination or be cited for violations. There has not been a change of policy but WPS seems to have applied a new interpretation to old policy. Milage is paid only to the closest geographic hospital without adequate documentation on the variance. Shane has been working with an HCA attorney so the issue can be addressed. Other services are experiencing similar audits. Patients are being told they will have to pay the mileage difference if they want to be transported to a hospital that is not the closest geographically.</p> <p>Announcement on MU burn center not having certain services. <i>(MU clarified at SAC meeting that MU would accept the burn patients and determine if they needed care elsewhere)</i></p> <p>Wall times for ambulance services at hospitals resulted in a lengthy discussion. Some large services in Region A have decided they will no longer do non-emergency transports. That results in certain hospital dismissals being delayed which means fewer beds available. This is a nationwide problem that needs broad discussion.</p> <p>A letter of resolution supporting the EMS Data Concept Committee’s efforts was approved. <p><b>BEMS</b> <b>Taz Meyer, Chief BEMS</b></p>	<p>Taz Meyer reported BEMS is gearing up to switch to NEMSIS 3.5. Ruby Mehrer inquired if the NEMSIS 3.5 efforts will be coordinated with other efforts such as the data concept group and possibly the MU researchers. Taz indicated his goal was for all to be coordinated and for all data parameters needs to be met. He indicated July 2023 is the timeline to transition NEMSIS 3.5. He indicated this is part of Image Trend and will not cost extra to upgrade.</p> <p>Taz announced BEMS has hired an investigator, Billy Miller, from Springfield. He has experience as an investigator and also has fire and EMS in his background.</p>	

<b>Interstate Compact</b> <b>Taz Meyer, Chief</b>	Taz Meyer reporting: Met Jan 18 on rules and also on training regarding the data base. MO reports to data base. Still in early states of training.	
<b>TCD Task Force</b> <b>Steve Bollin, DHSS</b>	Steve Bolin reporting: The TCD Task Force met last Thursday. On Jan 31 <sup>st</sup> there is a meeting to discuss the candidates for the TCD Advisory Council. After the discussion, the recommended candidates will be considered by the selection committee. The intention will be to organize the group and get it in concert with SAC. The law now says the TCD Advisory Committee will report to SAC and the SAC on EMS will report to the TCD Advisory Committee. Access for prehospital EKGs to be transmitted prearrival to the hospital is being discussed. Solutions are being investigated. Steve said partnership with MU for data analysis could have value for TCD data.

<b>EMSC, Liz Kendrick</b>	Danielle Lee reporting for Liz. The EMSC survey was sent out Jan 1, 2023. 71 of the EMS agencies in MO have answered, that represents 33%. Follow up calls will be starting in February to encourage responding to the survey. Dani will send the link for the survey.  Data is being sorted by regions this year. <b>911 System, Jason White</b>	The 911 Board is overseeing \$8 million to improve GIS in MO. This year efforts are concentrated in the North and next year the South will be mapped. GIS data will be put on the MU website. \$10 million ARPA funds have been delayed while DPS reevaluates the process.	

	<p>Pulse Point is working with local PSAPs to collect AED locations in the state.  Legislation has been filed to move EMD from DHSS to 911.  PSAPs need to define EMD parameters and obtain medical director oversight.  Legislation has been filed to make dispatchers or communication specialists eligible for First Responder benefits.  Social Media is being used to attract people that might be interested in the 911 system and responsibilities.</p>
