

How You Can Help Stop Medicare and Medicaid Fraud

1. Keep a record of the healthcare services and products you receive, including names, dates and places.

2. Review your Medicare or Medicaid summary notices to see if they match your record. If the summary information doesn't look right:

A. Call the health care provider.

B. If you aren't satisfied with the provider's response, call the "carrier" or "fiscal intermediary" listed on your summary notice.

C. If you still aren't satisfied with the response, call either the:

- SORT program (Missouri's program to fight Medicare/Medicaid fraud):

Be a Medicare CLAIM counselor. Give one-on-one help to people in your community so they can understand their Medicare coverage and claims. Two or more hours per month.

SORT

(Seniors Organized to Restore Trust)

Be a Medicare SORT and fraud/abuse counselor. Give one-on-one help to people in your community. Two or more hours per month.
