



2018 Facts

Since 2016, the percent of adults who engaged in high risk behaviors* for contracting HIV has decreased



*Only measures behaviors that have occurred within the past year. Behaviors include: injected unprescribed drugs; been treated for STD; received money or drugs in exchange for sex.


