## To Help Identify TB Disease Know the Red Flags in Chest X-ray Reports



Probably Not a TB Disease Suspect •negative •no infiltrates •no active disease •no tuberculosis •normal •clear

**Comments to Look For in CXR Reports:** 

**OPneumonic Process** frequently in the right upper lobe.

**OInterstitial Infiltrates.** 

**OPossibility of cavitary lesion.** 

OMass, lesion, often needing a CT Scan to further define.

**OPleural effusion (considered TB until proven otherwise).** 

## **OParenchymal disease.**

**ONodular densities consistent with old granulomatous disease.** 

**ORUL** densities.

**ONodular densities.** 

OLinear parenchymal changes.

**O**, Hilar or Perhilar adenopathy.

OThickening/blunting of right costophrenic angle.
